

What Week 1 actually looks like

One page. No account needed. This is the first week of QuantAim in a real classroom — what you do, what students do, and what you can see afterwards.

Before the first class (about 10 minutes)

Step	What you do
1	Create an account, then request teacher access from your Account page.
2	Create your first class. You get a join code.
3	Give students the join code. They self-enrol — you never create student accounts.
4	Assign Module 1, Money Basics . Students get a dashboard notification instantly.

A single 45-minute period

Time	Phase	What happens
0–10	Concept warm-up	You project the lesson's Hook and Concept sections and set the goal for the period.
10–30	Independent practice	Students work the assigned lesson's quiz at their own pace. It grades on submission.
30–40	Data review	You open the class-wide concept breakdown and discuss which ideas landed and which didn't.
40–45	Exit ticket	Students finish the lesson's built-in quiz if they haven't already.

What you can see by Friday

Where	What it shows
Mastery dashboard	Per-student mastery and completion, plus a flag on students who need help.
Portfolio review	Every simulated trade with the student's written reasoning attached.
Gradebook export	A CSV grade report for the class, whenever you want one.

The practical questions

If the wifi drops	Quiz answers save one question at a time, not in one submit at the end, so a student loses at most the question they were on. Sessions tolerate a 15-minute gap before closing, so a short outage doesn't distort time-on-task.
If you're out	Whatever you assigned is already on every student's dashboard and grades itself. A substitute opens the room and nothing else needs handing over.
How it fits the year	18 modules map to a 9-week quarter, an 18-week semester, or a full year. The pacing guide at quantaim.org/pacing-guide lays it out week by week.
Module size	Roughly 8–10 lessons each. Modules 1–4 move fastest; 5–9 are the ones classes most often spend two weeks on.
